So often we forget the many gifts we've been given so that when Thanksgiving comes upon us, we struggle to feel grateful. The experience Norma Rae and I have had with Dolly and Molly, is a powerful reminder that love is the most important part of life to be thankful for. So, why give thanks? Because love is always a process of reciprocation. Through our gratitude, we complete the loving circle with God.



October 12, 2021 Council Meeting Minutes

Attendance: Abby Betzold, Barry Tulkki, Rae Wooldridge, Sandy Morris, Ginny Ormsby, Dave Bowman, Heather Rushfeld, Sheldon Betzold, Sherry Monson

Pastor Garth opened meeting in prayer

September Minutes were read by Ginny O. and approved. Motions to accept minutes were made by Abby B. and Barry T.

Treasure & Financial Secretary Report: Ginny reported the church is taking in less but also spending less this past month. They had to take out \$20,000.00 from the Money Market Account. The balance in the account is approximately \$50,000.00. A motion by Abby B. and second by Barry T. to approve the report. Motion passed. **Clerks Report:** Sandy M. reported there was a death of one member, Shirley Johnson, in September and a death of one member, Mary Monson, in August. Current church membership at 163.

Youth Directors Report: Abby B. reported 8-10 students participated in the Youth Sunday Service. There are 5 student participating in Confirmation. Current Youth Group attendance has been averaging 8-10 per week. **Trustee Report:** Dave B. indicated they did not have a meeting in September. They will be meeting on the 3rd Sunday's prior to worship. They are seeking 2 members to replace Rick Maukstad and Scott Smith. Chad Leonard's term will also be up at the end of the year. Duane Morris accepted one of the replacement positions. They are thinking that some of the church building projects may need to be hired from outside services. They will be scheduling a fall workday to address the landscaping and cleaning of roof drains. Discussion on reforming a Pastor Parish Committee. The phone system is working. Seeking opinion regarding the ceiling tiles.

Board of Christian Education: Abby B. reported they have had low attendance for Sunday School. Post cards sent to families. Christmas Program is set for Sunday December 12th. It was decided they would not have a Family Fun Day this fall.

Diaconate Report: Barry T. reported that the name tags have been ordered and would be made up for regular attenders and located on the table in the Narthex. They are wanting to start having regular greeters. They are planning to ask each committee to be responsible for a month. The committees do not have to do all the greeting for the month but would be responsible to find volunteers. They do have prayer request cards available with a box to check if they want a meeting with the pastor and a box to check if they would like it shared via email to church members.

Congregational Giving Report: Abby B. reported they will be sending out a letter to members the week after the Budget & Election meeting on November 14th. Alek Keller-Betzold and Kate Bevington have agreed to join the committee.

Mission & Social Concerns Committee Report: Heather R. reported they sent out a survey to parents regarding LGBTQ. They had 23 respond. Most responses were positive. There is 1 child who is thinking about attending youth group
