PASTOR'S POINT

Dear All, happy Valentines month to you all. In this month, when society focuses on "romantic" love, I'd like to talk about discipleship types of love. In this kind of love, we learn of, demonstrate, and pass seeking the best for the other, love on that type of love Jesus has given us.

Here's the setting for this month's text. Jesus is at the end of his earthly ministry, it is the Upper Room, has just finished with the Passover Meal, Judas has just left to betray Jesus, and now Jesus and the remaining disciples are together. Jesus takes this last opportunity for "one last teaching session with the disciples...and the topic is about "how to carry on" in Jesus absence. Please read the text below.

Joh 13:33-35 ESV Little children, yet a little while I am with you. You will seek me, and just as I said to the Jews, so now I also say to you, 'Where I am going you cannot come.' (34) A new commandment I give to you, that you love one another: just as I have loved you, you also are to love one another. (35) By this all people will know that you are my disciples, if you have love for one another."

Jesus' talks about love and makes these key points: a) soon I will be gone, b) you can't follow me, c) this is your new Commandment, love each other as I have loved you, d) show others that you are my disciples through your love for each other.

THEE deciding fact that is

deterministic as to whether you are one of my disciples or not is "do you love one another, as I have loved you?" Love by putting others ahead of yourselves, love by which cares more for the other than for one's self. You know these attributes.

But, now in the absence of the leader, can you keep doing what the leader (Jesus) does and has shown you how to do? In essence, can you do what Jesus does, without Jesus by your side.

I can relate to Jesus' sentiments of this passage. In several months, I will no longer be with vou. I will move onto the next chapter in my life. I will be "there" and you will be "here". We will be separated from each other. We do not know what tomorrow will be like, but we do know how Jesus and his love (His New Commandment Love) will effect our lives. For me the greatest challenge is for me to be sure you all know of this love, AND that you act on it. The greatest compliment you can give to me is to love one another as Jesus called his disciples to love each other.

By this all people will know that you are my disciples, if you have love for one another."

It's a big challenge, but love, Jesus' love is really the answer. Amen!



Council Meeting: Jan. 14, 2020

ATTENDANCE: Pastor Barry Schaefer, Sheldon Betzold: Moderator, Virginia Ormsby: Treasurer, Sandy Morris: Clerk, Richard Wooldridge: Financial Secretary, Charlotte Gillen: Youth Director and Christian Education, Chad Leonard: Trustees, Abby Betzold: Congregational Giving, Rae Wooldridge: Congregational Giving, Shanon Hayes: Missions & Social Concerns, Julie Smith: Recording Secretary Pastor Barry opened the meeting with prayer at 6:03 pm.

Sheldon read the council minutes from December and they were voted on and approved.

TREASURER: Virginia presented the Treasurer's Report and was happy to state that we are "in the black". **CLERK:** Sandy reported that there was one member funeral this month. Sandy stated that the current membership role is at 171.

FINANCIAL SECRETARY: Sheldon welcomed Richard Wooldridge to the council as Financial Secretary. They discussed briefly what the job entails and Chad will assist him with the position.

YOUTH: Char stated that the month of December was a busy time for the Youth and they were involved with many Christmas activities and events. She presented her Youth Director Report highlighting all the activities.

BOARD OF CONGREGATIONAL GIVING: Abby said her committee is working to update the "wish lists" to help provide ideas when monetary gifts come to the church.



Pastor's Report for DECEMBER 2019

I AREAS OF ACCOMPLISHMENT

- This December was very typical for the month of Christmas. There was much frenetic activity, both church related and personal family related. This year All of the four Sundays of Advent occurred in December (doesn't always happen this way. We also, due to a late Thanksgiving, held our Hanging of the Greens service on the first Sunday of December. Thanks to Barry Tulkki for creating our Hanging of the Greens service for us, as well as for putting together the Lighting of the Advent Candle ceremonies for us as well. Many thanks to all of the families who helped with the hanging of the Greens, with the Advent Ceremonies, and who helped with our Lefse orders for Christmas as well as the seasonal offerings (Veterans of the Cross) and the Fifth Sunday Potluck meal.
- This month we lost one of our very long-lived members (12/26), Dorothie Mueller, who lived for 101 years. This is a very notable achievement. We will mourn her loss and we will also celebrate Dorothie's entrance into Jesus kingdom in her resurrection life.
- This years Christmas program was a very good one. Many of our youth, Sunday School students and staff worked long and hard at this event. Thanks to all who made it such a success.
- One of the "behind the scenes" narratives that the church has been dealing with has been the pre-mature birth of Hailey Russo, born at 14 weeks and born with significant health issues. Her due date was to be December 22, 2019. Hailey suffered mightily and her last day on earth, surrounded by her family was on December 26, the same day we buried Dorothie Mueller: 101 days to 101 years. Those two were "linked" together. (Hailey's funeral was on Jan 3, 2020 and will be reported with January stats.) Our congregation has been awesome in dealing with the needs of both families. Thank you, one and all for your support of prayers, food, patience and en-



- couragement. The births and deaths of our members are very large endeavors, and I thank you all for your help.
- On December 29th 2019 at the 10am worship service, I announced my intention to retire this year. It is estimated that my last Sunday will be on July 5th at the 10am worship concluding nearly 35 years of service to the Amery. A very difficult day indeed. I know that the Pastoral Search Committee is forming and they will do a great job in their calling. God will continue to bless this congregation.
