

# HAPPY FATHER'S DAY!

#### The Godly Father By Rev. Kenneth W. Hagin

We should always be grateful for examples of a Godly father. Thankfully, I have a number of examples in my life, including my own father, Kenneth E. Hagin, and my father-in-law, V. E. Tipton. Whether in life or in memory, godly fathers teach and train us how to live lives that are pleasing to our Heavenly Father. That's why Father's Day is so important. So, I want to take a

look at the characteristics of a godly father. The letters f-at-h-e-r provide us with a good way to remember these characteristics.

F—Faithful. A godly father is faithful, honors his marriage vows, protects his children, and shows constant allegiance to his Heavenly Father. In Genesis 22, Abraham displayed his faithfulness when he, out of obedience to God, was willing to offer Isaac, his son, as a sacrificial offering.

Another example of this faithfulness is God Himself. Hebrews 11:6 tells us that God is faithful to reward those "...that diligently seek him."

WHO FOLLOW

PROVERBS 20:7 NLT

A—Affectionate. A godly father loves his children and shows it. Everyone needs to feel loved. If children do not get the affection they need from their fathers, they will be forced find it elsewhere. But when a father shows affection to the family with a pure and sincere heart, he strengthens and unites the family. Affection instills faith and security in children. If children know that their father is there for them and are confident in his love for them, they will not hesitate to go to their father in their hour of need.

T—Trusting. As a godly father teaches his children biblical principles and moral values by being an example for them to follow, he develops trust and faithfulness in his children. He expects them to make the right decisions when they need to, even when he is not around. Trust between a father and his children generates happiness, hope, confidence, and security. Also, as a father trusts his children more, they trust him more. The more

children trust their father, the more confidence they have in trusting God.

H—Honorable. A godly father is honest and meets his obligations promptly. In doing so, he protects the integrity of his family's name. Even if the father doesn't realize it, his children watch him. If children observe their father taking exception to rules, they will see the exception and take it as the rule. And it has been said that what parents do in moderation,

children will do in excess. As a godly father lives a life above reproach, he lays a path for his children to walk uprightly before the Lord.

E—Energetic. A godly father is not slothful or lazy. He provides for his family. Paul's instructions to men in the treatment of wives would also apply to treatment of the whole family. Ephesians 5:25 says, "Husbands, love your wives, even as Christ also loved the church, and gave himself for it." The godly father gives of himself to his

family. He spends energy on his children; he pays attention to them. He also teaches his children—by example—to spend their energy helping other people and not just themselves.

R—Rewarded. A godly father is rewarded. By raising his children in a godly manner, he is rewarded by seeing his children mature and achieve success. I have always had more pleasure watching Craig and Denise achieve things than I did in achieving things for myself. And what a joy it is to see your children make quality decisions on their own, hearing from God for themselves! What a reward it is to see Craig and Denise both working with us in this ministry. It's rewarding to see your children grow up and bless others with what they do!

I challenge all fathers to be godly fathers. Your children are watching. People in your community, your neighborhood, and even in your church are watching. There may be children around you who do not have natural fathers to look up to. Be an example for them. Be a godly father!

#### Council Meeting: May 14, 2019

ATTENDANCE: Pastor Barry Schaefer, Sheldon Betzold: Moderator, Virginia Ormsby: Treasurer, Sandy Morris: Clerk, Charlotte Gillen: Youth Director, Chad Leonard: Trustees, Sherry Monson: Deacons, Abby Betzold: Congregational Giving, Rae Wooldridge: Congregational Giving, Julie Smith: Recording Secretary Pastor Barry opened the meeting with prayer at 6:00 pm.

Abby read the Council meeting minutes from April and they were reviewed. Julie motioned to approve the minutes, Char seconded and they were voted on and approved.

TREASURER: Virginia presented the Treasurer's Report. She and Chad stated that essentially we are in better shape than last month. However, for the overall year of 2019, we are still experiencing a deficit. The Treasurer's report for April was voted on and approved.

CLERK: Sandy reported that one wedding took place last month and Pastor Barry officiated at that ceremony. No other new changes to report on the church rolls.

FINANCIAL SECRETARY: Not present.

YOUTH: Char presented her April report. Many of the Youth's activities for April were involved with planning and presenting the Son Rise Service for Easter morning. The wonderful service was followed by a hearty pancake breakfast. Another service project the Youth participated in during April was Feed My Starving Children (held at a mobile pack at the Polk County Fairgrounds) Together they packed enough food to feed 82 children for a year!

TRUSTEE: Chad discussed items that were covered during the recent Trustees meeting. They discussed the need to have accurate descriptions and expectations of all personnel associated with the church. Also several pews in the church are in need of repair. Changes to improve and update the sound system within the sanctuary are planned for after Memorial Day weekend, the first part of June. No Trustee meeting is scheduled for June because of the Mission Trip.

CHRISTIAN EDUCATION: Char presented the report that was submitted by the Christian Ed. Committee. She highlighted that VBS this year has been scheduled for June 23-27 here at the Congo. (It is our turn to host; past 2 vears were at First Lutheran.)

**DIACONATE:** Sherry brought up a concern on how committees are selected to usher. Sometimes we are short of ushers. She said that we might need to find ways to improve on the current system. Ideas were brought forth and discussed. Also ways to assure that coffee fellowship is scheduled correctly and ways to improve on that were also discussed.

BOARD OF CONGREGATIONAL GIVING: Abby said her committee did not meet last month, but will be having a meeting this Sunday. Some discussion was held about e-giving as opposed to traditional offerings.

MISSION AND SOCIAL CONCERNS: Not present.

PASTOR REPORT: Pastor Barry discussed and highlighted a few of the items that were presented in his written re-

CALENDAR REVIEW: The June calendar was reviewed and discussed. A few revisions and corrections were made on the calendar and then approved.

OLD BUSINESS: Rae discussed pricing for inscriptions for The Tree of Life memorial and revisions and possible updates were discussed. She explained that she is formulating a form to be filled out by persons purchasing a memorial leaf. This would help to clarify expectations and provide a lasting record for the church.

NEW BUSINESS: Abby brought up questions regarding giving and financial commitments and if they have changed in light of recent church revisions and stewardship campaigns. Chad explained that the amount of giving is very similar to last year; no dramatic changes have been noted. Discussions were held on strategies and ideas to help close the financial shortfall for 2019.

The successful Walleye Dinner will probably be scheduled again for the Lenten season. Sherry brought the idea of the Chicken and Biscuits Dinner. In the past this has been a successful fundraiser, and outreach for our church, but it is difficult to try to schedule it during the busy fall season, especially with all the competing Fall Fest activities. Pastor Barry emphasized the importance of working in conjunction with other churches. Not only can we schedule around their dinners/activities, we can also promote each other's events. His said our Dinner/Theater was widely promoted throughout town. To achieve this goal of knowing when our neighboring churches are hosting events, Pastor asked Julie to provide a worksheet/listing of local churches events and meals. This way, we can work to avoid scheduling conflicts. Julie will put something together by the next Council Meeting. (July)

Chad motioned for adjournment, Virginia seconded.

Meeting was adjourned at 7:35 pm.
