GETTING THE BEST NEW MINISTER MEANS CREATING THE "RIGHT" LOCAL CHURCH PROFILE

We want the best minister we can find who matches our needs and prayers for a happy, healthy, and faithful church. And, I believe we have a good chance of making that happen. That's why our church's Search Committee is making and taking the time to create a church profile that reflects our true history, present, and calling into God's Realm on Earth.

Studies have shown that many pastoral mismatches have occurred because the way the search committees have described their church doesn't jibe with reality. They may have presented the congregation in unrealistic or inaccurate terms, thus attracting candidates who were not appropriate "fits" for the church as it actually was. An honest, true, and 'right' profile establishes a foundation that allows us to explore truthfully both our history and our hopes for the future.

And, as you may know, members of our Search Committee are already beginning the process of writing our Local Church Profile. In it they'll need to include:

Statistics to be gathered (concerning the church and concerning the community);

Information to be gathered (concerning the church and the community);

Interpretive/narrative information to be prepared;

A Leadership Expectation Checklist to be completed by a large group of church members;

References for the church to be identified.

AND, much more

This is why we are calling ALL our parishioners to be a part of helping us create our Local Church Profile. We will be receiving your input via several pathways:

Zoom Focus Groups (4 Wednesdays in January at 6pm- Call Office!)

Questionnaires emailed and snailmailed (beginning in February)

Phone calls for specific questions Larger gatherings when we're able to spread out outside (according to safe pandemic practices)

By May we'll probably be ready to share our first draft with the entire congregation to discern whether we believe the content actually reflects who we are and accurately describes the kind of pastor we are seeking.

NOTE: The sooner most parishioners give our input, the sooner we might be able to achieve a first draft and the "right" final version of our Local Church Profile. AND, once the profile is complete and signed by Wisconsin Conference staff, we will publish it online and begin receiving potential pastors' profiles in return... We'll be on our way to finding the best pastor for our beloved community.

FINALLY: "If our Local Church Profile accurately reflects our church's strengths, identity, gifts, and vocation—even as we re discerning what God is calling/claiming us to become in the future—we will never be tempted to seek a pastor to "recreate our past." Rather, we will come to understand—as a result of our faithful work—that we are engaged in a unique, visionary enterprise. We will seek out a new pastor who is eager to work with God and the congregation discerning a new future together, utilizing the strengths, the spirit, and the gifts of all." 
The traditional January birth flowers are the **carnation** and the **snowdrop**.

Carnations are regarded as The Flowers of God and the association harks back to Dianthus, their scientific name which is the contribution of Theophrastus, the Greek botanist. The name is split into the Greek words dios (Zeus) and anthos (flower). Carnations are also symbolic with love and are popular for their lovely fragrance.

Pink Carnations are representative of pure emotions and are associated with a Christian tale where they bloomed when Virgin Mary shed tears for Jesus while he bore the cross of crucifixion.

Snowdrops Although not as widely recognized as carnations, these plants are also considered as a January birth flower. They give out captivating white, droopy-shaped flowers. Blooming in the winter between January and March, snowdrops are a known symbol of hope and rebirth. They are also called Galanthus.



Council Meeting: December 8, 2020 (Zoom meeting)

ATTENDANCE: Pastor Garth Schumacher, Sheldon Betzold: Moderator, Virginia Ormsby: Treasurer, Sandy Morris: Clerk, Richard Wooldridge: Financial Secretary, Charlotte Gillen: Youth Director and Christian Education, Barry Tulkki: Diaconate, Chad Leonard: Trustees, Abby Betzold: Congregational Giving, Kate Bevington: Mission and Social Concerns, Rae Wooldridge: Congregational Giving, Julie Smith: Recording Secretary

Pastor Garth opened the meeting with prayer at 6:04 pm.

Barry Tulkki motioned to approve the minutes from the November meeting as published. Abby seconded the motion, it was voted on and approved.

TREASURER: Virginia presented the Treasurer's report. She explained that we are currently under budget with income, but also under budget with expenses. At year end we will be experiencing a shortfall. The budget that was approved requires approximately \$17,000 per month to make budget.

The November budget was voted on and approved.

CLERK: Sandy said that there are no changes to report this month. The current membership role stands at 168.

YOUTH: Char reported that the Youth group was able to have one get-together prior to the recent pandemic shutdown. They assisted with some flyers for the homeless shelter and also enjoyed a pizza party.

TRUSTEES: Chad gave an updated report on the completed grease trap system in the kitchen. In addition to completing that work, the kitchen was cleaned thoroughly from top to bottom. Many helpers assisted and were able to make the kitchen spotless. Rae commented that when the County came back to use the kitchen they were amazed at how clean it was and were very appreciative of our efforts. Chad also reported that the Trustees will be meeting this coming up Sunday.

CHRISTIAN EDUCATION: Char reported on the Christian Education program. A virtual Christmas program will be presented on December 20. (on the church's website and the Facebook live feed)

DIACONATE: Barry Tulkki reported that a phone tree calling system is currently in place. The calls to members hopefully will help to keep people informed and feel connected with each other.

CONGREGATIONAL GIVING: Abby said that the committee has not met this past month, but they hope to meet soon to discuss plans for 2021 and also year end shortfalls.

MISSION AND SOCIAL CONCERNS: Kate reported that her committee established a plan to send out cards and notes to people who have not been able to connect with the church via **v**irtual services or Facebook. About 40 cards were recently sent out to shut-ins and/or folks who don't have internet access. Kate stressed that her committee is happy to send cards out, just let them know who needs that connection.

PASTOR REPORT: Pastor Garth said he continues to make weekly calls to members, virtual services and virtual Bible studies. He also would like to continue an on-line Zoom coffee fellowship at 11:15 on Sunday mornings.

OLD BUSINESS: "Open and Affirming" program was briefly discussed. Also the recording of services was discussed and the options for airing them on local access programming was brought up. Several avenues for accomplishing this will be pursued. Pastor Garth confirmed this would be a great way to reach out to the community.

NEW BUSINESS: Sheldon reported that Cheryl Bowman has agreed to serve on the Diaconate. It was voted on and approved for Cheryl to be on this committee.

Sheldon said the next Council Meeting is scheduled for Tuesday, January 12 at 6:90 mg

Meeting was adjourned at 6:44 pm.
